The State of South Carolina is seeking to establish statewide term contracts for the purchase of household appliances (refrigerators, freezers, ranges, microwave ovens, dishwashers, washers, dryers and combos) by State Agencies and political subdivisions in South Carolina the awards will be awarded by lots with the highest percent discount yielding most savings for the state.

### MAXIMUM CONTRACT PERIOD - ESTIMATED (MODIFIED)

### III. SCOPE OF WORK/SPECIFICATIONS

The State of South Carolina is seeking to establish statewide term contracts for the purchase of household appliances (refrigerators, freezers, ranges, microwave ovens, dishwashers, washers, dryers and combos) by State Agencies and political subdivisions in South Carolina. The awards will be awarded by lots with the highest percent discount yielding the most savings for the State. The lots are broken into (6) six categories **and a minimum of at least 25% discount off the published catalog price is required.**

- Lot 1 – Refrigerators & Freezers
- Lot 2 – Ranges, Cooktops, Ovens & Hoods
- Lot 3 – Microwaves (Countertops & Over-The-Range)
- Lot 4 – Dishwashers
- Lot 5 – Washers & Dryers Residential
- Lot 6 – Refrigerator-Freezers/Microwaves Combination

Your discount must apply to a published catalog, price sheet, or price schedule that:

- (a) is regularly maintained by a manufacturer or vendor of an item;
- (b) is either published or otherwise available for inspection by customers;
- (c) states prices at which sales are currently or were last made to a significant number of buyers constituting the general buying public for the supplies, services, or information technology involved.

The pricing in this catalog is the established catalog price as defined in §11-35-1410(4). Your bid must be based on the established catalog price in effect at the time of bid submission. This pricing will remain in effect for the initial term of the contract, except that the State shall receive the benefit of any price reductions. No specialized catalog price is acceptable.

**EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS-** All units must be UL approved. Color shall be white, with manufacturer’s standard colors available as options at no additional cost.

**STANDARD PRODUCTS-** All appliances and their component parts listed in this bid shall be standard products of the manufacturer or its suppliers. Items furnished shall be current-year-models design. All parts subject to wear shall be accessible for repair or adjustment.

**MATERIALS-** Materials not specifically defined shall be of the quality normally used by the manufacturer, provided the completed items comply with all provisions of the specifications. All materials used shall be unused in their present state and free from defects which affect serviceability or appearance of the finished product.

**WORKMANSHIP-** All appliances shall be clean and free from any defects affecting appearance, serviceability, or safety of the user in normal intended use.

**MARKING FOR IDENTIFICATION-** The manufacturer’s standard nameplate data shall be placed on all appliances according to the manufacturer’s standard practice.

**SERVICE-** Dealer/authorized service for warranties must be available within twenty-four (24) hours for all household appliances listed herein. If the State is unable to obtain service/warranty within twenty-four (24) hours of placing a service call or if difficulties are encountered in obtaining service from the service location designated by the contractor, it shall be the complete responsibility of the contractor to arrange and coordinate service by an alternate service provider. The contractor

shall provide a specific individual to handle all service/warranty issues.

**PARTS LIST-** Contractor(s) shall make available upon request by the UGU a complete parts list with each appliance delivered.

**SPECIFICATIONS FOR REFRIGERATORS-** The refrigerators shall be self-contained units comprising an insulated cabinet evaporator and electric-motor-driven condensing unit. The interior of the insulated cabinet shall be divided into a general food storage compartment and a frozen-food compartment. Combination refrigerator-freezer units shall have two or more doors with freezer mounted on the top, or side-by-side. All EnergyStar refrigerators shall be clearly labeled as such on the website. All refrigerator and freezer sections to be frost-free, with exception of the compact refrigerator which has manual defrost.

- a. **Doors:** Must have the option of either right- or left-hand door openings. The using agency will specify the swing at the time of order. Additional charges for altering the swing on the door will not be allowed. Storage space shall be molded in door liner. Door latch shall be the magnetic gasket type.
- b. **Shelves:** Shelves shall be full width and full depth and of the wire, bar, or reinforced stamped type except the shelf over the crisper shall be of glass or styrene plastic.
- c. **Crispers Drawer:** To be full width or dual and constructed of corrosion resistant materials.
- d. **Ice Cube Trays and Grids:** Ice cube trays shall be aluminum alloy, corrosion-resisting steel, polypropylene, or copolymer plastic. Ice cube grids shall be corrosion resistant. If providing metal ice cube trays, each shall have a mechanical, quick release for ejection of ice cubes.
- e. **Cabinets:** The design and fabrication of the refrigeration system and cabinet shall prevent water vapor and water from the outside and water from the inside from entering the insulated space during usage and cleaning. The bottom sheet shall be securely fastened to the outer shell and provide a rigid structure to maintain the insulated vapor seal.
- f. **Electrical Characteristics:** Refrigerators shall operate satisfactorily on a 120-volt, 60 Hz, single phase, alternated-current electrical system. All refrigerators shall be completely electrically wired. A three-wire cord with a three-prong attachment plug shall be provided and shall extend at least five (5) feet, but not more than nine (9) feet, beyond the point at which it is attached to the back of the cabinet. The cable assembly consisting of a cable and grounding plug connector shall conform to UL Standards. The cord and attachment plug shall provide grounding at the refrigerator.
- g. **Lighting:** Each refrigerator shall be provided with interior illumination for the general food compartment. An OFF/ON switch for lights shall be operated automatically by opening the door. Switches for lights which are operated automatically by door openings shall not be located in the bottom breaker strip nor in the bottom outer case panel. Light bulbs shall be protected from condensate drip. Interior illumination shall be provided in the freezer compartment on side-by-side model refrigerators.
- h. **Refrigeration System:** The refrigeration system shall be sealed and designed to operate with refrigerants complying with federal and state regulations.
- i. **Condensing Unit:** The condensing unit shall be an air-cooled type consisting of a motor, compressor, condenser, control, and other necessary equipment.
- j. **Evaporators:** The evaporators shall be either forced air or gravity type.
- k. **Compressor:** Hermetically sealed, size to meet capacity requirements.
- l. **Defrost Water:** Defrost water shall be collected in a readily cleanable, readily removable vessel, or shall be carried out of the cabinet to evaporating apparatus. Means shall be provided to prevent defrost water from dropping on food in the general food storage compartment. Tubes, pipes, or baffles used to collect, or carry defrost water shall have corrosion-resistant surfaces and shall be readily cleanable unless positioned to be self-cleaning by means of condensate entering the device.
- m. **Refrigerant and Oil Charge:** The assembled refrigeration system shall be completely dehydrated and charged with the proper amount of refrigerant and oil necessary for operation. Methanol may be used provided its use is approved by the compressor manufacturer and the warranty of the compressor and any other components of the condensing unit is not voided.
- n. **Refrigeration Control:** The refrigeration control shall be a temperature control switch activating the compressor motor, fan motor, or both compressor and fan motors. The differential of the temperature control shall be such that the individual temperature changes in the general food storage compartment shall not exceed 6°F and frozen food storage compartment shall not exceed 4°F. The temperature control shall be accessible for adjustment and servicing.
- o. **Interior:** Interior of refrigerator and freezer compartment shall be corrosion-resistant aluminum-alloy sheet, carbon-steel sheet with porcelain enamel finish, carbon-steel sheet, or molded plastic.
- p. **Exterior:** Shall be carbon-steel sheet finished with baked-on enamel with rust prevention base coat.
- q. **Insulation:** Fiberglass, polystyrene or urethane foam.
- r. **Plastics:** All plastics used in the refrigerator shall not impart significant odor or taste to food or water. Plastics shall not craze, crack, or permanently distort, from temperature, contamination, incompatibility with materials of

- construction or load under conditions of normal use or during storage in temperatures ranging from 0 to 140°F.
- s. **Leveling Devices:** All refrigerators shall be equipped with leveling devices capable of leveling the refrigerators in accordance with the manufacturer's standard practice.
- t. **Ice Maker:** Ice makers shall be available as an option to the models indicated on the bidding schedule. Ice maker may be purchased separately. Exception — Ice maker will not be available for compact models.
- u. **Ice Storage Bin:** An ice storage bin to be furnished with all models except compact size. Bin to hold approximately 9 lbs. of ice.

**SPECIFICATIONS FOR FREEZERS-** The freezers shall be self-contained freezer units comprising an insulated cabinet evaporator and electric motor-driven condensing units. Freezers shall be of the chest type and upright models. Freezers shall be manual defrost for chest models and frost-free types for upright models. All EnergyStar freezers shall be clearly labeled as such on the website.

- a. **Doors:** Door latch shall be the magnetic gasket type. Upright freezers shall have the option of either right- or left-hand door openings. The using agency will specify the swing at the time of order. Additional charges for altering the swing on the door will not be allowed. Both the upright and chest type models to have locking mechanism on doors.
- b. **Shelves/Baskets:** Upright models to have full width and full depth shelves and door storage. Chest models to be supplied with two or more removable storage baskets.
- c. **Electrical Requirements:** Freezer shall operate satisfactorily on the electrical system specified. The freezers shall operate on three-wire nominal 110-120-volt, 60 Hertz power supply. A three-wire cord with a three-prong attachment plug shall be provided conforming to UL Standards.
- d. **Finish:** Finish shall be in accordance with manufacturer's standard practice.
- e. **Insulation:** The space between the outer shells and the inner liners shall be filled with insulation that is resistant to fungus, rot, and vermin. The insulation provided shall be resistant to and installed to prevent settling. Insulation may be fiberglass, polystyrene or polyurethane.
- f. **Refrigeration System:** The refrigeration system shall be completely dehydrated and charged with the amount of refrigerant and oil necessary for operation. The condensing unit shall be an air-cooled type consisting of a motor, compressor, condenser, control, and other necessary equipment. The evaporators shall be either forced air or gravity type.
- g. **Compressor:** Hermetically sealed, size to meet capacity requirements.
- h. **Interior:** Interior of freezer compartment shall be corrosion-resistant aluminum-alloy sheet, carbon-steel sheet with porcelain enamel finish, carbon-steel sheet, or molded plastic. Drain plug in bottom to carry defrost water away.
- i. **Exterior:** Shall be carbon-steel sheet finished with baked-on enamel with rust prevention base coat.
- j. **Plastics:** All plastics used in the freezer shall not impart significant odor or taste to food or water. Plastics shall not craze, crack, or permanently distort from any of the following: temperature, contamination, incompatibility with materials of construction or load under conditions of normal use or during storage in temperatures ranging from 0 to 140°F.
- k. **Leveling Devices:** All freezers shall be equipped with leveling devices capable of leveling the freezer in accordance with the manufacturer's standard practice.
- l. **Freezer Control:** The freezer control shall be a temperature control switch activating the compressor motor, fan motor, or both compressor and fan motors. The differential of the temperature control shall be such that, the individual temperature changes in freezer compartment shall not exceed 4°F. - a. **Type Range:** Free-standing (20", 30") and Drop-In (27")
- b. **Type Oven:** Conventional and self-cleaning, size — 20", 27", 30" (Free Standing/ Drop-In)
- c. **Surface Heating Units:** The ranges shall be provided with 8-inch and 6-inch nominal diameter surface heating units. Ranges included on the bid schedule may have either one (1) 8-inch and three (3) 6-inch heating units or two (2) 8-inch and two (2) 6-inch heating units. The heating element for the surface units shall be encased in a seamless metal tube. The surface heating units shall be hinged or easily removable and easily replaceable to permit cleaning. Means shall be provided to allow replacement of the hinged surface heating units by use of hand tools. A reflector pan shall be furnished under each surface heating unit. Ranges and ovens equipped with removable oven doors will be acceptable. A heat resisting viewing window shall be provided.
- i. **Oven Light:** Ovens shall be provided with a light to illuminate the oven interior. The light shall be located or protected to prevent being damaged. The oven light may be actuated by opening the door or by use of a separate switch except a separate oven light switch shall be provided when a heat resisting viewing window oven door is furnished.
- j. **Temperature Control:** The temperature of the oven compartment shall be controlled by a snap-action thermostat and a separate switch or by a thermostat with an "OFF" position. The "OFF" position shall be marked on the thermostat dial. The thermostat actuating components shall be protected against moisture, grease, and direct heat radiation. A detent or other means shall be provided on all controls to prevent the control from being accidentally turned on.
- k. **Leveling Devices:** All ranges shall be equipped with at least two leveling devices capable of leveling the range in accordance with the manufacturer's standard practice.
- l. **Finish:** Finish shall be in accordance with manufacturer's standard practice.

**SPECIFICATIONS FOR MICROWAVE OVENS-** Countertop Microwave, with optional under-cabinet hanging bracket

- a. **Requirements:** Microwave ovens shall have a minimum of 10 power levels, 3 categories of quick touch cooking, and 3 categories of auto defrost.
- b. **Controls:** Each microwave oven shall be equipped with electronic touch controls. The microwave shall include a display with clock and a kitchen timer.
- c. **Finish:** Finish shall be in accordance with manufacturer's standard practice.

**SPECIFICATIONS FOR DISHWASHERS-** Dishwashers included in the bid schedule must be EnergyStar certified. Dishwasher shall be provided with the proper number of controls for automatic operations. - g. **Finish:** All washing machines outer tubs and clothes baskets coming into contact with the wash water shall be steel finished with porcelain enamel or made of corrosion-resistant steel. Exterior visible surfaces of washing machine, not including trim, shall be finished with porcelain enamel or baked-on enamel. The cabinet back and all interior surfaces shall be of corrosion-resistant material or coated to resist corrosion. The exterior trim shall be that which is normally furnished by the manufacturer.
- h. **Plumbing Hoses and Connections:** The water inlet hoses shall have connections to fit standard ¼ inch hose fitting threads. The hose shall be of sufficient length to permit connection to faucets minimum of 2 feet to left or right of machine and 42 inches above floor. - h. **Interior:** The drying-tumbler basket shall be of the revolving type. The opening to the basket shall be from the front side. The basket shall be made of corrosion-resistant steel, zinc-coated steel or steel finish with porcelain and be rust resistant and chip resistant. Any part of the appliance that comes in contact with the clothes shall have a smooth-finished surface and be free from burrs so as to prevent snagging and ripping of clothing. The walls of the basket shall have vanes to give the clothes motion in a path about the axis of the basket.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, contractor may assign monies receivable under the contract provided that the state shall have no obligation to make payment to an assignee until thirty days after contractor (not the assignee) has provided the responsible procurement officer with (i) proof of the assignment, (ii) the identity (by contract number) of the specific state contract to which the assignment applies, and (iii) the name of the assignee and the exact address or account information to which assigned payments should be made. (b) If contractor amends, modifies, or otherwise changes its name, its identity (including its trade name), or its corporate, partnership or other structure, or its FEIN, contractor shall provide the procurement officer prompt written notice of such change. (c) Any name change, transfer, assignment, or novation is subject to the conditions and approval required by Regulation 19-445.2180, which does not restrict transfers by operation of law. ### **BANKRUPTCY - GENERAL (FEB 2015)**

(a) Notice. In the event the Contractor enters into proceedings relating to bankruptcy, whether voluntary or involuntary, the Contractor agrees to furnish written notification of the bankruptcy to the Using Governmental Unit. This notification shall be furnished within two (2) days of the initiation of the proceedings relating to the bankruptcy filing. This notification shall include the date on which the bankruptcy petition was filed, the identity of the court in which the bankruptcy petition was filed, and a listing of all State contracts against which final payment has not been made. This obligation remains in effect until final payment under this Contract. (b) Termination. This contract is voidable and subject to immediate termination by the State upon the contractor's insolvency, including the filing of proceedings in bankruptcy. [07-7A005-2]

As used in this paragraph, the term "Agreement" means any transaction or agreement arising out of, relating to, or contemplated by the solicitation. [07-7A010-1]

### **CONTRACT AWARDED PURSUANT TO CODE (MAR 2024)**

Any contract resulting from this solicitation is formed pursuant to the South Carolina Consolidated Procurement Code and is deemed to incorporate all applicable provisions thereof and the ensuing regulations. See also clause titled "Code of Laws Available." [07-7A012-1]

### **CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and ORDER OF PRECEDENCE (FEB 2015)**

(a) Any contract resulting from this solicitation shall consist of the following documents: (1) a Record of Negotiations, if any, executed by you and the Procurement Officer, (2) the solicitation, as amended, (3) documentation of clarifications [11-35-1520(8)] or discussions [11-35-1530(6)] of an offer, if applicable, (4) your offer, (5) any statement reflecting the State's final acceptance (a/k/a "award"), and (6) purchase orders. These documents shall be read to be consistent and complimentary. Any conflict among these documents shall be resolved by giving priority to these documents in the order listed above. (b) The terms and conditions of documents (1) through (5) above shall apply notwithstanding any additional or different terms and conditions in any other document, including without limitation, (i) a purchase order or other instrument submitted by the State, (ii) any invoice or other document submitted by Contractor, or (iii) any privacy policy, terms of use, or end user agreement. Except as otherwise allowed herein, the terms and conditions of all such documents shall be void and of no effect. (c) No contract, license, or other agreement containing contractual terms and conditions will be signed by any Using Governmental Unit. Any document signed or otherwise agreed to by persons other than the Procurement Officer shall be void and of no effect. [07-7A015-2]

## **DISCOUNT FOR PROMPT PAYMENT (JAN 2006)**

(a) Discounts for prompt payment will not be considered in the evaluation of offers. ## **DISPUTES (JAN 2006)**

All disputes, claims, or controversies relating to the Agreement shall be resolved exclusively by the appropriate Chief Procurement Officer in accordance with Title 11, Chapter 35, Article 17 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, or in the absence of jurisdiction, only in the Court of Common Pleas for, or a federal court located in, Richland County, State of South Carolina. Contractor agrees that any act by the government regarding the Agreement is not a waiver of either the government's sovereign immunity or the government's immunity under the Eleventh Amendment of the United States Constitution. As used in this paragraph, the term "Agreement" means any transaction or agreement arising out of, relating to, or contemplated by the solicitation. (2) Service of Process. Contractor consents that any papers, notices, or process necessary or proper for the initiation or continuation of any disputes, claims, or controversies relating to the Agreement; for any court action in connection therewith; or for the entry of judgment on any award made, may be served on Contractor by certified mail (return receipt requested) addressed to Contractor at the address provided as the Notice Address on Page Two or by personal service or by any other manner that is permitted by law, in or outside South Carolina. Notice by certified mail is deemed duly given upon deposit in the United States mail. [07-7A025-1]

## **EFT INFORMATION (APR 2024)**

The Contractor must furnish to the State Treasurer's Office information necessary for making a payment by electronic funds transfer (EFT). Additional information is available at the STO's website at <https://treasurer.sc.gov> (.). The Contractor is responsible for the currency, accuracy and completeness of the EFT information. Updating EFT information may not be used to accomplish an assignment of the right to payment, does not alter the terms and conditions of this contract, and is not a substitute for a properly executed contractual document. ## **FALSE CLAIMS (JAN 2006)**

According to the S.C. Code of Laws Section 16-13-240, "a person who by false pretense or representation obtains the signature of a person to a written instrument or obtains from another person any chattel, money, valuable security, or other property, real or personal, with intent to cheat and defraud a person of that property is guilty" of a crime. ## **FIXED PRICING REQUIRED (JAN 2006)**

Any pricing provided by contractor shall include all costs for performing the work associated with that price. Except as otherwise provided in this solicitation, contractor's price shall be fixed for the duration of this contract, including option terms. This clause does not prohibit contractor from offering lower pricing after award. [07-7A040-1]

## **NO INDEMNITY OR DEFENSE (FEB 2015)**

Any term or condition is void to the extent it requires the State to indemnify, defend, or pay attorney's fees to anyone for any reason. [07-7A045-2]

## **NOTICE (JAN 2006)**

(A) After award, any notices shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given (1) upon actual delivery, if delivery is by hand, (2) upon receipt by the transmitting party of automated confirmation or answer back from the recipient's device if delivery is by telex, telegram, facsimile, or electronic mail, or (3) upon deposit into the United States mail, if postage is prepaid, a return receipt is requested, and either registered or certified mail is used. (B) Notice to contractor shall be to the address identified as the Notice Address on Page Two. Notice to the state shall be to the Procurement Officer's address on the Cover Page. Either party may designate a different address for notice by giving notice in accordance with this paragraph. [07-7A050-1]

## **OPEN TRADE (JUN 2015)**

During the contract term, including any renewals or extensions, Contractor will not engage in the boycott of a person or an entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with whom South Carolina can enjoy open trade, as defined in SC Code Section 11-35-5300. [07-7A053-1]

## **ORGANIZATIONAL CONFLICT OF INTEREST (APR 2023)**

(a) The Contractor agrees to immediately advise the Procurement Officer if an actual or potential organizational conflict of interest is discovered after award, and to make a full written disclosure promptly thereafter to the Procurement Officer. This disclosure shall include a description of actions which the Contractor has taken or proposes to take, after consultation with the Procurement Officer, to avoid, mitigate, or neutralize the actual or potential conflict.

(b) The State may terminate this contract for convenience, in whole or in part, if it deems such termination necessary to avoid an organizational conflict of interest. Contractor's failure to include an appropriate termination for convenience clause in any subcontract shall not increase the obligation of the State beyond what it would have been if the subcontract had contained such a clause.

(c) The disclosure required by paragraph (a) of this provision is a material obligation of the contract. If the Contractor knew or should have known of an organizational conflict of interest prior to award, or discovers an actual or potential conflict after award, and does not disclose, or misrepresents, relevant information to the Procurement Officer, the State may terminate the contract for default. ## **PAYMENT and INTEREST (FEB 2021)**

The State shall pay the Contractor, after the submission of proper invoices or vouchers, the prices stipulated in this contract for supplies delivered and accepted or services rendered and accepted, less any deductions provided in this contract. Unless otherwise specified herein, including the purchase order, payment shall not be made on partial deliveries accepted by the Government. (b) Unless otherwise provided herein, including the purchase order, payment will be made by electronic funds transfer (EFT). See clause titled " EFT Information." (c) Notwithstanding any other provision, payment shall be made in accordance with S.C. Code Section 11-35-45, or Chapter 6 of Title 29 (real property improvements) when applicable, which provides the Contractor's exclusive means of recovering any type of interest from the Owner. Contractor waives imposition of an interest penalty unless the invoice submitted specifies that the late penalty is applicable. Except as set forth in this paragraph, the State shall not be liable for the payment of interest on any debt or claim arising out of or related to this contract for any reason. (d) Amounts due to the State shall bear interest at the rate of interest established by the South Carolina Comptroller General pursuant to Section 11-35-45 (" an amount not to exceed fifteen percent each year “), as amended, unless otherwise required by Section 29-6-30. (e) Any other basis for interest, including but not limited to general (pre- and post-judgment) or specific interest statutes, including S.C. Code Ann. Section 34-31-20, are expressly waived by both parties. If a court, despite this agreement and waiver, requires that interest be paid on any debt by either party other than as provided by items (c) and (d) above, the parties further agree that the applicable interest rate for any given calendar year shall be the lowest prime rate as listed in the first edition of the Wall Street Journal published for each year, applied as simple interest without compounding. (f) The State shall have all of its common law, equitable and statutory rights of set-off. [07-7A055-4]

## **PUBLICITY (JAN 2006)**

Contractor shall not publish any comments or quotes by State employees or include the State in either news releases or a published list of customers, without the prior written approval of the Procurement Officer. [07-7A060-1]

## **PURCHASE ORDERS (JAN 2006)**

Contractor shall not perform any work prior to the receipt of a purchase order from the using governmental unit. The using governmental unit shall order any supplies or services to be furnished under this contract by issuing a purchase order. Purchase orders may be used to elect any options available under this contract, e.g., quantity, item, delivery date, payment method, but are subject to all terms and conditions of this contract. Purchase orders may be electronic. No particular form is required. An order placed pursuant to the purchasing card provision qualifies as a purchase order. [07-7A065-1]

## **SURVIVAL OF OBLIGATIONS (JAN 2006)**

The Parties' rights and obligations which, by their nature, would continue beyond the termination, cancellation, rejection, or expiration of this contract shall survive such termination, cancellation, rejection, or expiration, including, but not limited to, the rights and obligations created by the following clauses: Indemnification - Third Party Claims, Intellectual Property Indemnification, and any provisions regarding warranty or audit. [07-7A075-1]

## **TAXES (JAN 2006)**

Any tax the contractor may be required to collect or pay upon the sale, use or delivery of the products shall be paid by the State, and such sums shall be due and payable to the contractor upon acceptance. Any personal property taxes levied after delivery shall be paid by the State. It shall be solely the State's obligation, after payment to contractor, to challenge the applicability of any tax by negotiation with, or action against, the taxing authority. Contractor agrees to refund any tax collected, which is subsequently determined not to be proper and for which a refund has been paid to contractor by the taxing authority. In the event that the contractor fails to pay, or delays in paying, to any taxing authorities, sums paid by the State to contractor, contractor shall be liable to the State for any loss (such as the assessment of additional interest) caused by virtue of this failure or delay. Taxes based on Contractor's net income or assets shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor. [07-7A080-1]

## **TERMINATION DUE TO UNAVAILABILITY OF FUNDS (JAN 2006)**

Payment and performance obligations for succeeding fiscal periods shall be subject to the availability and appropriation of funds therefor. When funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal period, the contract shall be canceled. In the event of a cancellation pursuant to this paragraph, contractor will be reimbursed the resulting unamortized, reasonably incurred, nonrecurring costs. Contractor will not be reimbursed any costs amortized beyond the initial contract term. [07-7A085-1]

## **THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY (JAN 2006)**

This Contract is made solely and specifically among and for the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective successors and assigns, and no other person will have any rights, interest, or claims hereunder or be entitled to any benefits under or on account of this Contract as a third party beneficiary or otherwise. [07-7A090-1]

## **WAIVER (JAN 2006)**

The State does not waive any prior or subsequent breach of the terms of the Contract by making payments on the Contract, by failing to terminate the Contract for lack of performance, or by failing to strictly or promptly insist upon any term of the Contract. Only the Procurement Officer has actual authority to waive any of the State's rights under this Contract. Any waiver must be in writing. [07-7A095-1]

## **VII. TERMS AND CONDITIONS -- B. SPECIAL**

### **CHANGES (JAN 2006)**

(1) Contract Modification. By a written order, at any time, and without notice to any surety, the Procurement Officer may, subject to all appropriate adjustments, make changes within the general scope of this contract in any one or more of the following:

- (a) drawings, designs, or specifications, if the supplies to be furnished are to be specially manufactured for the [State] in accordance therewith;
- (b) method of shipment or packing;
- (c) place of delivery;
- (d) description of services to be performed;
- (e) time of performance (i.e., hours of the day, days of the week, etc.); or,
- (f) place of performance of the services. Subparagraphs (a) to (c) apply only if supplies are furnished under this contract. Subparagraphs (d) to (f) apply only if services are performed under this contract.

(2) Adjustments of Price or Time for Performance. If any such change increases or decreases the contractor's cost of, or the time required for, performance of any part of the work under this contract, whether or not changed by the order, an adjustment shall be made in the contract price, the delivery schedule, or both, and the contract modified in writing accordingly. Any adjustment in contract price made pursuant to this clause shall be determined in accordance with the Price Adjustment Clause of this contract. Failure of the parties to agree to an adjustment shall not excuse the contractor from proceeding with the contract as changed, provided that the State promptly and duly make such provisional adjustments in payment or time for performance as may be reasonable. By proceeding with the work, the contractor shall not be deemed to have prejudiced any claim for additional compensation, or an extension of time for completion.

(3) Time Period for Claim. Within 30 days after receipt of a written contract modification under Paragraph (1) of this clause, unless such period is extended by the Procurement Officer in writing, the contractor shall file notice of intent to assert a claim for an adjustment. Later notification shall not bar the contractor's claim unless the State is prejudiced by the delay in notification.

(4) Claim Barred After Final Payment. No claim by the contractor for an adjustment hereunder shall be allowed if notice is not given prior to final payment under this contract.

### **COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS (JAN 2006)**

During the term of the contract, contractor shall comply with all applicable provisions of laws, codes, ordinances, rules, regulations, and tariffs. [07-7B035-1]

### **CONFERENCE -- PRE-PERFORMANCE (JAN 2006)**

Unless waived by the Procurement Officer, a pre-performance conference between the contractor, state and Procurement Officer shall be held at a location selected by the state within five (5) days after final award, and prior to commencement of work under the contract. The responsibilities of all parties involved will be discussed to assure a meeting of the minds of all concerned. The successful contractor or his duly authorized representative shall be required to attend at contractor's expense.

### **CONTRACT LIMITATIONS (JAN 2006)**

No sales may be made pursuant to this contract for any item or service that is not expressly listed. No sales may be made

pursuant to this contract after expiration of this contract. Violation of this provision may result in termination of this contract and may subject contractor to suspension or debarment. [07-7B045-1]

### **CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL (JAN 2006)**

The Contractor shall enforce strict discipline and good order among the Contractor's employees and other persons carrying out the Contract. The Contractor shall not permit employment of unfit persons or persons not skilled in tasks assigned to them. [07-7B060-1]

### **CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATION -- GENERAL (JAN 2006)**

The contractor shall provide and pay for all materials, tools, equipment, labor and professional and non-professional services, and shall perform all other acts and supply all other things necessary, to fully and properly perform and complete the work. The contractor must act as the prime contractor and assume full responsibility for any subcontractor's performance. The contractor will be considered the sole point of contact with regard to all situations, including payment of all charges and the meeting of all other requirements. [07-7B065-1]

### **DEFAULT (JAN 2006)**

(a) (1) The State may, subject to paragraphs (c) and (d) of this clause, by written notice of default to the Contractor, terminate this contract in whole or in part if the Contractor fails to:

- (i) Deliver the supplies or to perform the services within the time specified in this contract or any extension;
- (ii) Make progress, so as to endanger performance of this contract (but see paragraph (a)(2) of this clause); or
- (iii) Perform any of the other material provisions of this contract (but see paragraph (a)(2) of this clause).

(2) The State's right to terminate this contract under subdivisions (a)(1)(ii) and (1)(iii) of this clause, may be exercised if the Contractor does not cure such failure within 10 days (or more if authorized in writing by the Procurement Officer) after receipt of the notice from the Procurement Officer specifying the failure.

(b) If the State terminates this contract in whole or in part, it may acquire, under the terms and in the manner the Procurement Officer considers appropriate, supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor will be liable to the State for any excess costs for those supplies or services. However, the Contractor shall continue the work not terminated.

(c) Except for defaults of subcontractors at any tier, the Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs if the failure to perform the contract arises from causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor. Examples of such causes include (1) acts of God or of the public enemy, (2) acts of the State in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, (3) fires, (4) floods, (5) epidemics, (6) quarantine restrictions, (7) strikes, (8) freight embargoes, and (9) unusually severe weather. In each instance the failure to perform must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor.

(d) If the failure to perform is caused by the default of a subcontractor at any tier, and if the cause of the default is beyond the control of both the Contractor and subcontractor, and without the fault or negligence of either, the Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs for failure to perform, unless the subcontracted supplies or services were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time for the Contractor to meet the required delivery schedule.

(e) If this contract is terminated for default, the State may require the Contractor to transfer title and deliver to the State, as directed by the Procurement Officer, any (1) completed supplies, and (2) partially completed supplies and materials, parts, tools, dies, jigs, fixtures, plans, drawings, information, and contract rights (collectively referred to as "manufacturing materials" in this clause) that the Contractor has specifically produced or acquired for the terminated portion of this contract. Upon direction of the Procurement Officer, the Contractor shall also protect and preserve property in its possession in which the State has an interest.

(f) The State shall pay contract price for completed supplies delivered and accepted. The Contractor and Procurement Officer

shall agree on the amount of payment for manufacturing materials delivered and accepted and for the protection and preservation of the property; if the parties fail to agree, the Procurement Officer shall set an amount subject to the Contractor's rights under the Disputes clause. Failure to agree will be a dispute under the Disputes clause. The State may withhold from these amounts any sum the Procurement Officer determines to be necessary to protect the State against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of former lien holders.

(g) If, after termination, it is determined that the Contractor was not in default, or that the default was excusable, the rights and obligations of the parties shall, if the contract contains a clause providing for termination for convenience of the State, be the same as if the termination had been issued for the convenience of the State. If, in the foregoing circumstances, this contract does not contain a clause providing for termination for convenience of the State, the contract shall be adjusted to compensate for such termination and the contract modified accordingly subject to the contractor's rights under the Disputes clause.

(h) The rights and remedies of the State in this clause are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this contract.

### **DISPOSAL OF PACKAGING (JAN 2006)**

The state may bid separately any unusual requirements or large quantities of supplies covered by this contract. [07-7B090-1]

### **ESTIMATED QUANTITY -- UNKNOWN (JAN 2006)**

The total quantity of purchases of any individual item on the contract is not known. The State does not guarantee that the State will buy any specified item or total amount. The omission of an estimated purchase quantity does not indicate a lack of need but rather a lack of historical information. [07-7B095-1]

### **ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION (NOV 2008)**

(An overview is available at [www.procurement.sc.gov](http://www.procurement.sc.gov)) By signing your offer, you certify that you will comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14 of the South Carolina Code of Laws and agree to provide to the State upon request any documentation required to establish either: (a) that Title 8, Chapter 14 is inapplicable to you and your subcontractors or sub-subcontractors; or (b) that you and your subcontractors or sub-subcontractors are in compliance with Title 8, Chapter 14. Pursuant to Section 8-14-60, "A person who knowingly makes or files any false, fictitious, or fraudulent document, statement, or report pursuant to this chapter is guilty of a felony, and, upon conviction, must be fined within the discretion of the court or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both." You agree to include in any contracts with your subcontractors language requiring your subcontractors to (a) comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14, and (b) include in their contracts with the sub-subcontractors language requiring the sub-subcontractors to comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14. ### **INDEMNIFICATION-INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY (JAN 2006)**

(a) Without limitation and notwithstanding any provision in this agreement, Contractor shall, upon receipt of notification, defend and indemnify the State, its instrumentalities, agencies, departments, boards, political subdivisions and all their respective officers, agents and employees against all actions, proceedings or claims of any nature (and all damages, settlement payments, attorneys' fees (including inside counsel), costs, expenses, losses or liabilities attributable thereto) by any third party asserting or involving an IP right related to an acquired item. State shall allow Contractor to defend such claim so long as the defense is diligently and capably prosecuted. State shall allow Contractor to settle such claim so long as (i) all settlement payments are made by Contractor, and (ii) the settlement imposes no non-monetary obligation upon State. State shall reasonably cooperate with Contractor's defense of such claim. (b) In the event an injunction or order shall be obtained against State's use of any acquired item, or if in Contractor's opinion, the acquired item is likely to become the subject of a claim of

infringement or violation of an IP right, Contractor shall, without in any way limiting the foregoing, and at its expense, either: (1) procure for State the right to continue to use, or have used, the acquired item, or (2) replace or modify the acquired item so that it becomes non-infringing but only if the modification or replacement does not adversely affect the specifications for the acquired item or its use by State. If neither (1) nor (2), above, is practical, State may require that Contractor remove the acquired item from State, refund to State any charges paid by State therefor, and take all steps necessary to have State released from any further liability. (c) Contractor's obligations under this paragraph do not apply to a claim to the extent (i) that the claim is caused by Contractor's compliance with specifications furnished by the State unless Contractor knew its compliance with the State's specifications would infringe an IP right, or (ii) that the claim is caused by Contractor's compliance with specifications furnished by the State if the State knowingly relied on a third party's IP right to develop the specifications provided to Contractor and failed to identify such product to Contractor. (d) As used in this paragraph, these terms are defined as follows: "IP right(s)" means a patent, copyright, trademark, trade secret, or any other proprietary right. "Acquired item(s)" means the rights, goods, or services furnished under this agreement. "Specification(s)" means a detailed, exact statement of particulars such as a statement prescribing materials, dimensions, and quality of work. (e) Contractor's obligations under this clause shall survive the termination, cancellation, rejection, or expiration of this Agreement. [07-7B103-1]

### **LICENSES AND PERMITS (JAN 2006)**

During the term of the contract, the Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining, and maintaining in good standing, all licenses (including professional licenses, if any), permits, inspections and related fees for each or any such licenses, permits and /or inspections required by the State, county, city or other government entity or unit to accomplish the work specified in this solicitation and the contract. [07-7B115-1]

### **MATERIAL AND WORKMANSHIP (JAN 2006)**

Unless otherwise specifically provided in this contract, all equipment, material, and articles incorporated in the work covered by this contract are to be new and of the most suitable grade for the purpose intended. [07-7B120-1]

### **PRICE ADJUSTMENTS (JAN 2006)**

(1) Method of Adjustment. Any adjustment in the contract price made pursuant to a clause in this contract shall be consistent with this Contract and shall be arrived at through whichever one of the following ways is the most valid approximation of the actual cost to the Contractor (including profit, if otherwise allowed):

- (a) by agreement on a fixed price adjustment before commencement of the pertinent performance or as soon thereafter as practicable;
- (b) by unit prices specified in the Contract or subsequently agreed upon;
- (c) by the costs attributable to the event or situation covered by the relevant clause, including profit if otherwise allowed, all as specified in the Contract; or subsequently agreed upon;
- (d) in such other manner as the parties may mutually agree; or,
- (e) in the absence of agreement by the parties, through a unilateral initial written determination by the Procurement Officer of the costs attributable to the event or situation covered by the clause, including profit if otherwise allowed, all as computed by the Procurement Officer in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, subject to the provisions of Title 11, Chapter 35, Article 17 of the S.C. Code of Laws.

(2) Submission of Price or Cost Data. Upon request of the Procurement Officer, the contractor shall provide reasonably available factual information to substantiate that the price or cost offered, for any price adjustments is reasonable, consistent with the provisions of Section 11-35-1830.

### **PRICE ADJUSTMENT - LIMITED -- AFTER INITIAL TERM ONLY (MODIFIED)**

Upon approval of the Procurement Officer, prices may be adjusted for any renewal term. Prices shall not be increased during the initial term. Neither party is an employee, agent, partner, or joint venturer of the other. Neither party has the right or ability to bind the other to any agreement with a third party or to incur any obligation or liability on behalf of the other party. [07-7B205-1]

#### **RELATIONSHIP OF USING GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (JAN 2006)**

Each Using Governmental Unit's obligations and liabilities are independent of every other Using Governmental Unit's obligations and liabilities. No Using Governmental Unit shall be responsible for any other Using Governmental Unit's act or failure to act. [07-7B210-1]

#### **SHIPPING / RISK OF LOSS (JAN 2006)**

F.O.B. Destination. Destination is the shipping dock of the Using Governmental Units' designated receiving site, or other location, as specified herein. (See Delivery clause) [07-7B220-1]

#### **STATEWIDE CONTRACT - MANDATORY (MAY 2024)**

(a) With this solicitation, the state seeks to establish a contract available for use by all South Carolina public procurement units (as defined in Section 11-35-4610(5)). This contract is a "term contract" as defined in Section 11-35-310(37). Accordingly, use by state governmental bodies (as defined in Section 11-35-310(18)), which includes most state agencies, is mandatory except under limited circumstances. See clause entitled "Acceptance of Offers 10% Below Price" in Part VII.B. of this solicitation. Use by local public procurement units is optional. Section 11-35-4610 defines local public procurement

units to include any political subdivision, or unit thereof, which expends public funds. Section 11-35-310(24) defines the term political subdivision as all counties, municipalities, school districts, public service or special purpose districts.

(b) The State is entitled to audit the books and records of you and any subcontractor to the extent that such books and records relate to the performance of the work. Such books and records will be maintained by the contractor for a period of three years from the date of final payment under the contract and by the subcontractor for a period of three years from the date of final payment under the subcontract, unless a shorter period is authorized in writing by the Chief Procurement Officer.

(c) Subject to the limitations herein, a Using Governmental Unit may include “additional contract terms” in a purchase order. #### **STATEWIDE CONTRACT – MANDATORY [TERM] - ACCEPTANCE OF OFFERS 10% BELOW PRICE (MAY 2024)**

Pursuant to Section 11-35-310(37), the state may purchase items available on this contract from a third party (an “alternate vendor”) if the alternate vendor offers a price at least ten percent less than the price established by this contract and, after being offered an opportunity, you decline to meet the alternate vendor’s price. With regard to the items acquired, the alternate vendor must agree to be bound by all the terms and conditions of this contract. All acquisitions pursuant to this clause must be documented by the procurement officer using the attached form. [07-7B227-2]

#### **STATEWIDE CONTRACT – MANDATORY - SCOPE (MAY 2024)**

The scope of this contract is limited by the Bidding Schedule / Cost Proposals and by the description included in Part I, Scope of Solicitation. Sales of supplies or services not within the scope of this contract are prohibited. See clause entitled Contract Limitations. [07-7B230-2]

#### **TERM OF CONTRACT -- EFFECTIVE DATE / INITIAL CONTRACT PERIOD (JAN 2006)**

The effective date of this contract is the first day of the Maximum Contract Period as specified on the final statement of award. The initial term of this agreement is (1) one year from the effective date. Regardless, this contract expires no later than the last date stated on the final statement of award. [07-7B240-1]

#### **TERM OF CONTRACT -- OPTION TO RENEW (FEB 2021)**

At the end of the initial term, and at the end of each renewal term, this contract shall automatically renew for a period of (1) one year unless contractor receives notice that the state elects not to renew the contract at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of renewal. Regardless, this contract expires no later than the last date stated on the final statement of award.

#### **TERM OF CONTRACT -- TERMINATION BY CONTRACTOR (JAN 2006)**

Contractor may terminate this contract at the end of the initial term, or any renewal term, by providing the Procurement Officer notice of its election to terminate under this clause at least 90 days prior to the expiration of the then current term.

## **TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE -- INDEFINITE DELIVERY / INDEFINITE QUANTITY CONTRACTS (JAN 2006)**

Unless the termination so provides, a termination for convenience shall not operate to terminate any purchase orders issued prior to the effective date of termination. [07-7B255-1]

### **TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE (JAN 2006)**

(1) Termination. The Procurement Officer may terminate this contract in whole or in part, for the convenience of the State. The Procurement Officer shall give written notice of the termination to the contractor specifying the part of the contract terminated and when termination becomes effective.

(2) Contractor's Obligations. The contractor shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated work and on the date set in the notice of termination the contractor will stop work to the extent specified. The contractor shall also terminate outstanding orders and subcontracts as they relate to the terminated work. The contractor shall settle the liabilities and claims arising out of the termination of subcontracts and orders connected with the terminated work. The Procurement Officer may direct the contractor to assign the contractor's right, title, and interest under terminated orders or subcontracts to the State. The contractor must still complete the work not terminated by the notice of termination and may incur obligations as are necessary to do so.

(3) Right to Supplies. The Procurement Officer may require the contractor to transfer title and deliver to the State in the manner and to the extent directed by the Procurement Officer: (a) any completed supplies; and (b) such partially completed supplies and materials, parts, tools, dies, jigs, fixtures, plans, drawings, information, and contract rights (hereinafter called "manufacturing material") as the contractor has specifically produced or specially acquired for the performance of the terminated part of this contract. The contractor shall, upon direction of the Procurement Officer, protect and preserve property in the possession of the contractor in which the State has an interest. If the Procurement Officer does not exercise this right, the contractor shall use best efforts to sell such supplies and manufacturing materials in accordance with the standards of Uniform Commercial Code Section 2-706. Utilization of this Section in no way implies that the State has breached the contract by exercise of the Termination for Convenience Clause.

(4) Compensation. (a) The contractor shall submit a termination claim specifying the amounts due because of the termination for convenience together with cost or pricing data required by Section 11-35-1830 bearing on such claim. If the contractor fails to file a termination claim within one year from the effective date of termination, the Procurement Officer may pay the contractor, if at all, an amount set in accordance with Subparagraph (c) of this Paragraph.

(b) The Procurement Officer and the contractor may agree to a settlement and that the settlement does not exceed the total contract price plus settlement costs reduced by payments previously made by the State, the proceeds of any sales of supplies and manufacturing materials under Paragraph (3) of this clause, and the contract price of the work not terminated;

(c) Absent complete agreement under Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph, the Procurement Officer shall pay the contractor the following amounts, provided payments agreed to under Subparagraph (b) shall not duplicate payments under this Subparagraph:

(i) contract prices for supplies or services accepted under the contract;

(ii) costs reasonably incurred in performing the terminated portion of the work less amounts paid or to be paid for accepted supplies or services;

(iii) reasonable costs of settling and paying claims arising out of the termination of subcontracts or orders pursuant to Paragraph (2) of this clause. These costs must not include costs paid in accordance with Subparagraph (c)(ii) of this paragraph;

(iv) any other reasonable costs that have resulted from the termination. The total sum to be paid the contractor under this Subparagraph shall not exceed the total contract price plus the reasonable settlement costs of the contractor reduced by the amount of payments otherwise made, the proceeds of any sales of supplies and manufacturing materials under Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph, and the contract price of work not terminated.

(d) Contractor must demonstrate any costs claimed, agreed to, or established under Subparagraphs (b) and (c) of this Paragraph using its standard record keeping system, provided such system is consistent with any applicable Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

(5) Contractor's failure to include an appropriate termination for convenience clause in any subcontract shall not (i) affect the State's right to require the termination of a subcontract, or (ii) increase the obligation of the State beyond what it would have been if the subcontract had contained an appropriate clause.

**WARRANTY -- STANDARD (JAN 2006)**

Contractor must provide the manufacturer's standard written warranty upon delivery of product. Contractor warrants that manufacturer will honor the standard written warranty provided. [07-7B280-1]

**IMPORTANT TAX NOTICE - NONRESIDENTS ONLY**

Withholding Requirements for Payments to Nonresidents: Section 12-8-550 of the South Carolina Code of Laws requires persons hiring or contracting with a nonresident conducting a business or performing personal services of a temporary nature within South Carolina to withhold 2% of each payment made to the nonresident. As provided in the solicitation, if a public procurement unit is offered the same supplies, services, or information technology at a price that is at least ten percent less than the term contract price, it may purchase from the vendor offering the lower price after first offering the vendor holding the term contract the option to meet the lower price. The solicitation used to establish the term contract must specify contract terms applicable to a purchase from the vendor offering the lower price. If the vendor holding the term contract meets the lower price, then the governmental body shall purchase from the contract vendor. All decisions to purchase from the vendor offering the lower price must be documented by the procurement officer in sufficient detail to satisfy the requirements of an external audit. A term contract may be a multi term contract as provided in Section 11-35-2030."
